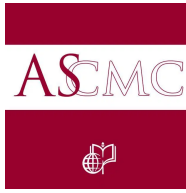

#### V. Advocates MOA Discussion

Michael: We're presenting our amendments to the advocates MOU. We added to the terms of the MOU saying that every ASCMC members shall complete teal dot training, we wanted to add it so that it reflects the shared values of ensuring safety in the CMC community. We also added VPSA shall communicate event plans no less than 10 days in advance in order to adequately plan and provide support at the events, particularly for parties planned and not on the schedule already supplied to



Advocates. Additional two clauses also about lifeguarding, clause 3 is that in the event that unsafe parties happen and ASCMC does fall short, we do not have to continue to be responsible for these events. Clause 4 states that advocates are not required to support off campus events. Last clause clarifies *new* advocates leadership, not old.

Desmond: advocates have been a long standing org, having these additions help my job easier. For off campus events, we do need to revisit the chaperoning model based on 100 days but advocates doesn't have to do so

Sam: I agree, it will make my life easier. Is there a way to write out what you would look for if advocates were to provide support for off campus events?

Celeste: For other campuses, we can consider if we were in communication with other advocates groups (since they don't lifeguard). We're open to having those conversations, the way that lifeguarding works at CMC since its a wet campus, advocates don't have any responsibility to control or report drinking, and that hasn't been an issue previously, and this may look differently if we were to do this on different campuses. We have collectively agreed though that we are not comfortable with lifeguarding off campus events.

Michael: I can see an instance where advocates would lifeguard at other 5c events, but here we just aren't mandated. If we deem it necessary, it is still an option as long as we ensure the safety of the advocates.

Wolfy: if we have an off campus events and advocates don't lifeguard, what alternative do we have? Hired security?

Sobe: I'm unsure about that clause, I understand 4C events. Rachel, former president of advocates, did not allow advocates on the vegas trip which makes sense due to the community + strangers. If the goal is to protect students, if it is a CMC only event, I don't see why it wouldn't carry over. Security isn't trained in SA training, and based on 100 days, they weren't very beneficial

Gio: Perhaps it's a gap in our planning that advocates doesn't have to fill, but then what is advocates role on campus? If the only difference between wedding party + 100 days is that one is on and one is off campus, I don't see why there's hesitation.

Sobe: They mentioned that it was tiring, particularly due to shifts. I would feel more comfortable paying for their ubers and etc rather than not having them at all. Advocates had hesitations on being there for the entire party/missing the party.

Chris: I think it's important to have support at these events. I don't think additional security would supplement advocates' presence.



Desmond: we need to have some sort of additional group regardless. The work often gets put then on various unpaid people (EC's), and if they can also work as supplemental advocates (they would need to have training), that is also an option.

Josh: I don't think it should be Advocates' job to clean up after a party.

Amari: Advocates should be doing their job lifeguarding for CMC events– not having them would simply lead towards us not having off campus events for seniors which no one would want.

Wolfy: Is there a way to approve that particular clause later on?

Zane: We don't have to approve yet.

Sobe: I like your idea Desmond but because of their long and extensive training, it seems that paying advocates for lifeguarding events instead can incentivize their presence.

Sam: I understand the hesitation for off campus events– they now have to deal with police, bouncers, and etc rather than just DOS. Paying for off campus events makes sense, and we should stress that the only job that they have is *exactly* what they would do on campus (not chaperone)

Kimi: should there be chaperones? What level of supervision should there be?

Sobe: Usually ASCMC members chaperone, helping with the bus and ticketing, taking the stress off of the class cabinet and putting it on the underclassmen in ASCMC instead.

Zane: The question is what does Advocates want itself to be versus what we see it as? We can continue this conversation, we don't have to approve this now. Our core understanding and respect for Advocates will be maintained until then.

Josh: We can keep their old MOU, but we need to have more discussion on this. We need at least a week to look at this.

Zane: Especially with the new officers

Wolfy: We can edit the clause to say “advocates will be compensated for off campus events” so it leaves it to their discretion, but the language is then inserted.

Amari: Should we ask the questions now or set up a meeting later?

Josh: We can ask now, but we need a longer conversation on this regardless.

## **VI. Updates on Mask Policy and Room Retention**

Sam: Rule is that in classrooms keep masks on, what qualifies as a classroom is vague. Do meetings in a classroom require a mask versus an actual class? There's a lot of ambiguity with the rest of the indoor requirement— ex: senate.

Aara: we did talk about classroom masking being mandated for sessions that individuals have to go to (to not put immunocompromised individuals in an uncomfortable position)

Kirby: has there been a broken down mask update sent to students? Is what was sent enough or should it be re-sent?

Caroline: It should be sent out again.

Kirby: It should be sent out as soon as tonight since we have classes tomorrow.

Caroline: there seems to be a misunderstanding with roberts staffing when it comes to masks (we (as student workers) were told that masking in roberts is still being figured out.)

Desmond: we've been given the greenlight to meet as a club maskless in bauer as its a student only meeting.

Josh: Is the core issue with masking specifically with professors?

Desmond: Yes.





Sam: if a professor is in the room, the default is mask on. It is a massive concern, particularly due to problems that can arise with non masking and the issues that can arise in feedback forms, consequently making issues with tenure.

Sam: I will fund with discretionary fund.

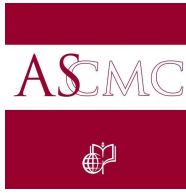
Desmond: You've been funded in full.
